The Division of Endocrinology at the University of Pittsburgh (Pitt) and its affiliated Medical Center (UPMC) seeks an MD or MD/PhD board-certified endocrinologist for a full time academic faculty position as the Director of its Multidisciplinary Thyroid Center (MTC).

Pitt/UPMC is one of the largest and most successful academic medical centers in the country and the largest employer in the state of Pennsylvania. In the most recent US News and World Report rankings, UPMC Presbyterian-Shadyside Hospital was ranked 14th and UPMC Endocrinology was ranked 8th in the nation. Likewise, in the most recent assessment of National Institutes of Health (NIH) funding, the University of Pittsburgh was ranked 4th and the Department of Medicine at the University of Pittsburgh was ranked in the top 10 in the nation.

Pitt/UPMC has a well-established MTC that includes endocrinologists, endocrine surgeons, pathologists, otolaryngologists, neuro-ophthalmologists, oncologists, radiologists, radiation oncologists, oncologists, and translational scientists. Together, the MTC team has a long history of clinical and academic excellence in virtually all aspects of thyroid disease, particularly in the use of molecular approaches in diagnosis and treatment. The program includes multidisciplinary thyroid clinics, several thyroid conference series, a quality improvement program, and ongoing research / scholarly work. The multidisciplinary nature of the thyroid program provides outstanding patient care as well as a rich environment for career development.

To maintain and expand this academic excellence, Pitt/UPMC is seeking a full-time, board-certified endocrinologist to lead the Multidisciplinary Thyroid Center. Endocrine Certification in Neck Ultrasound (ECNU) is also preferred. Candidates should have strong expertise in thyroidology and be willing to contribute to all aspects of the academic mission (clinical care, education, quality, and scholarly work). Candidates with research interests/qualifications and potential for external funding in the field of thyroidology/thyroid cancer are highly desirable. The successful candidate should have leadership experience and a strong desire to lead the MTC into the future. The primary appointment will be in the Division of Endocrinology within the Department of Medicine. An academic appointment at the University of Pittsburgh would be commensurate with experience, training, and achievement.
