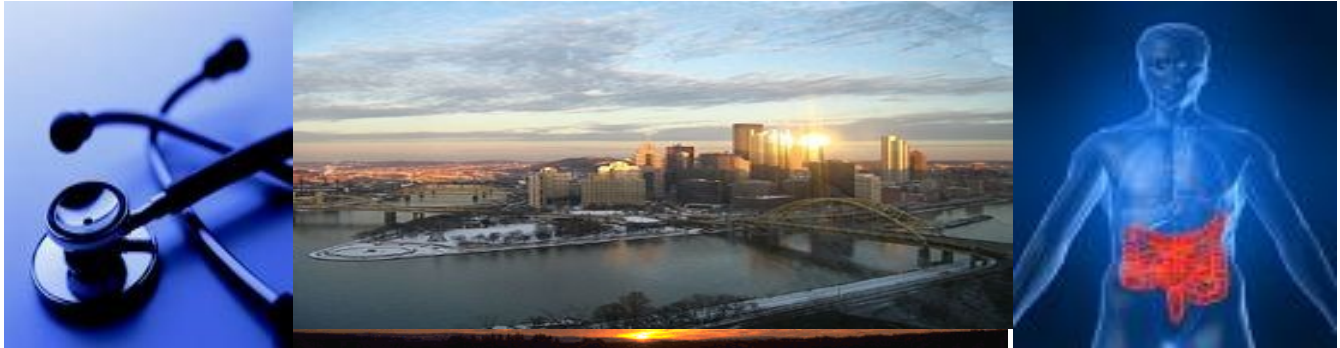


# IBD Fellowship



Applications for July 2019 are now being accepted for one year of advanced training in Inflammatory Bowel Disease at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center.

## Training Overview

The IBD advanced fellows' training program is designed to meet individual interests and preferences. This advanced fellow will participate in a clinical and translational research program geared to an academic appointment, including IBD genetics, mucosal immunology, epidemiology, advanced patient care, clinical trials, and novel treatment plans. The candidate will also hold an Instructor of Medicine attending position with the Division of Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition and will be responsible for eight (8) weeks on the inpatient UPMC general GI service.

## Pre-Requisites

- Internal Medicine training completion
- Completion of an accredited three-year gastroenterology fellowship program or equivalent
- License to practice medicine in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- Appropriate non-U.S. citizen Visa requirements, if applicable
