The University of Pittsburgh Medical Center's one-year *accredited* Advanced Fellowship in Transplant Hepatology prepares trainees for a successful career with ABIM certification in the field of transplant hepatology. Excellent training is provided in advanced liver diseases, immunosuppression and all aspects of transplant hepatology through educational collaborations with the acclaimed UPMC Center for Liver Diseases and Thomas E. Starzl Transplantation Institute.

The UPMC Liver Transplantation Program is one of the largest programs in the United States for liver transplantation and advocates for living donor liver transplantation for appropriate patients. Liver surgeries, kidney, pancreas, small bowel, heart and lung transplants are performed as well.

Applications are being accepted for **traditional 4th year** and **accelerated 3rd year** trainees for this one-year advanced fellowship. Eligible candidates must have completed or be enrolled in an accredited three-year gastroenterology fellowship program. Applications are being considered currently for July 1, 2022.
