Highlights include involvement with multidisciplinary care models such as Total Care-IBD (UPMC IBD medical home), a PCORI grant, and access to a large patient population with tertiary referrals. The applicant will join our already strong IBD faculty team. The position is located within the UPMC health system, a multibillion dollar health care provider, which offers a health insurance product with over 4 million subscribers. The University of Pittsburgh offers a stellar basic science and clinical translational research foundation, and consistently ranks within the top 10 institutions receiving NIH funding. Qualified candidates will have an academic focus on clinical care, research, and education. Experience working with diverse populations is welcome. A record of research investigation is desirable.

We are seeking a full-time, BC/BE gastroenterology to expand the Division's IBD Center. The candidate will have or be eligible for an unrestricted medical license in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The successful candidate will possess clinical skills to facilitate outpatient/inpatient care and teaching within a large, dynamic academic medical center. Qualified candidates will have an academic focus on clinical care, research, and education.

The Division of Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition possesses strong translational programs of clinical and research excellence in IBD, pancreatic disease, GI cancer, disorders of GI motility, hepatology, and transplant medicine. With 60 faculty, advanced and internationally recognized clinical and research initiatives, and a multidisciplinary focus on innovation, leading-edge technologies, and education, the Division is among the top collaborative academic GI groups in the U.S.

The Department of Medicine has 665 full time faculty in ten divisions. The Department of Medicine supports a broad array of exceptional research programs featuring many nationally known academic physicians and scientists. The Department of Medicine is one of the most balanced in the U.S. related to clinical/research stability. Its basic, translational, and clinical research programs continue to grow rapidly, with the FY19 research expenditure over \$102 million. The Department of Medicine's NIH funding level is consistently ranked within the top 10 nationally, among other Departments of Internal Medicine.

The **University of Pittsburgh** and its principal partner, the **University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (UPMC)**, together have raised the standard of scientific and medical excellence in southwestern Pennsylvania and have positioned biomedical science and health care as a driving force behind the region's economy.
