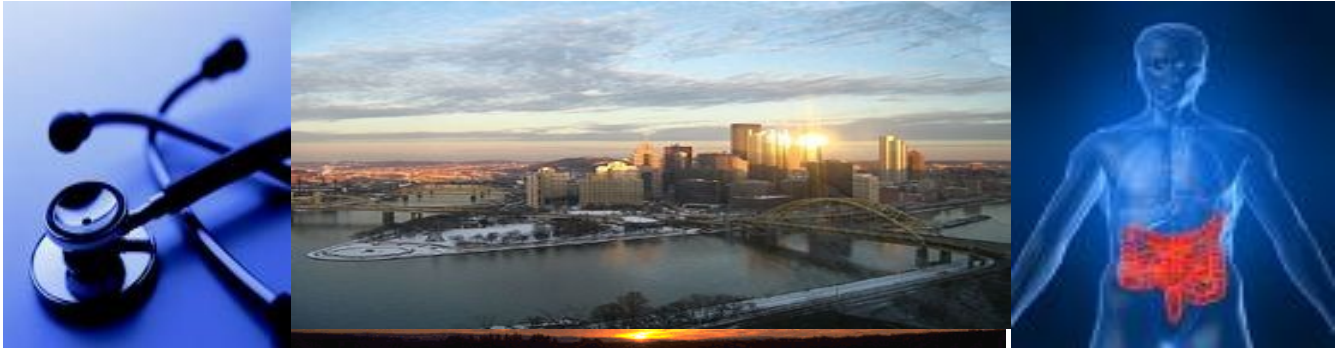


IBD Fellowship



Applications for July 2024 are now being accepted for one year of advanced training in Inflammatory Bowel Disease at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center.

Training Overview

The Advanced IBD Fellowship Program is designed to meet a individual interests in IBD training, and can be tailored to a more clinically or research focused pathway. UPMC has a large population of complex IBD patients. The fellow's clinical experience will include the inpatient care of IBD patients on our dedicated IBD service, outpatient clinics, including our multi-disciplinary, comprehensive "Total Care-IBD" model, and outpatient IBD endoscopy. Additional learning opportunities include participation in weekly IBD conference, Pittsburgh-area IBD Collaborative, regional IBD case conference (IBD Live), Grand Rounds, Gut Club, and participation in IBD patient education events. Research opportunities include those with our IBD registry, Total Care-IBD database, and clinical trials, among others.

- Completion of an accredited three-year gastroenterology fellowship program or equivalent
- License to practice medicine in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- Appropriate non-U.S. citizen Visa requirements, if applicable
