Substance Treatment and Recovery Service (STARS) at Presbyterian

Quaternary care hospital with high addiction medicine consult volume of ≈60% opioids, 30% alcohol, 10% other.

Special populations: endocarditis, transplant patients

Magee-Womens Hospital Perinatal Addiction Services

Inpatient addiction consults (PACES) and outpatient clinic (Pregnancy and Women's Recovery Center) for woman-identifying individuals with OUD.

Special populations: pregnant, gyne onc patients



Internal Medicine-Recovery Engagement Program (IM-REP)

Integrated primary care-addiction treatment. 90% OUD + 10% other.

Special services: harm reduction, contingency management, wound care, palliative-addiction care (P-REP)

Center for Treatment of Addictive Disorders (CTAD) at Pittsburgh VA

Lower volume, outpatient + groups with occasional inpatient consults via psychiatry. Dedicated teaching on mental health treatment. Includes methadone, contingency management. *Special populations: veterans*



Pain

Mix of inpatient and outpatient experiences depending on fellow's interests. Typically includes some time with palliative care managing cancer pain inpatient and outpatient.

Pennsylvania Organization for Women in Early Recovery (POWER)

Freestanding withdrawal management and rehab facility staffed by physicians and APPs from the Division of General Internal Medicine.

Special populations: women





Community

Fellow's choice of community-based activities including recovery support meetings, low-barrier buprenorphine bus, post-incarceration clinic, and street medicine. *Special populations: unhoused*

Adolescent and Young Adult-Specific Rotations

Various rotation sites including 412 Youth Zone, Highlands Detention Center, Center for Adolescent and Young Adult Health (CAYAH), Community Intensive Supervision Project, and UPMC Children's Hospital.



Opioid Treatment Program

Longitudinal methadone clinic at Tadiso during non-consult weeks. Opportunity to do mobile methadone treatment via Tadiso.



Rural Rotations

Mix of inpatient and outpatient addiction treatment sites at UPMC Northwest in Seneca, PA and Safe Harbor in Erie, PA.

Special populations: pregnant, adolescents, rural
